2011 COAL TRADE

The effects of Canada's looming ban on the use of coal for power generation were clearly evident in 2011. Shipments of coal totaled 27.6 million tons, a decrease of 13.6 percent from 2010, and a drop of 24.5 percent compared to the trade's 5-year average. The only port to register an increase was Chicago. Loadings at KCBX and Chicago Fuels Terminal rose by 45.5 percent.
