2007 IRON ORE TRADE

Iron ore shipments on the Great Lakes totaled 58.1 million net tons in 2007, a slight decrease from both the previous year and the trade's 5-year average. Had the Lakes fleet been able to carry full loads, the deficit could have been erased by just a handful of vessels. Instead, the chronic lack of adequate dredging trimmed vessels' per-trip carrying capacities by as much as 16 percent.
