2005 LIMESTONE TRADE

Shipments of limestone from U.S. and Canadian ports on the Great Lakes totaled 37.7 million net tons in 2005, a decrease of 6.2 percent from 2004. While the decline reflects a downturn in steel production that affected demand for fluxstone and a sluggish construction market that required less aggregate, it should be noted the 2004 total was the highest in a number of years. As a result, the comparison with limestone's 5-year average (37.6 million net tons) is quite different; the trade was in fact slightly ahead of its long-term average in 2005.

Another factor should be noted. Severe and frequent storms idled the U.S.-Flag Lakes fleet for roughly 5,000 hours in November. Canadian Lakers suffered similar delays and the results were apparent in all cargo totals for that month.
