2013 U.S.-FLAG DRY-BULK CARGO CARRIAGE TO / FROM CANADA (CROSS-LAKES TRADE)

Cargos moving between the United States and Canada in U.S.-flag lakers fell considerably in 2013. Shipments slumped to 2.9 million tons, a decrease of 26.7 percent, and a drop of more than 42 percent compared to the long-term average.

The 60-percent decrease in iron ore cargos reflects lower steel production in Canada. The coal total - 556,000 tons - continued the decline that began when Ontario decided to phase out coal for power generation.

Limestone cargos registered a modest increase and cement's total was in line with 2012. Sand and salt recorded small increases, while grain dipped by 10,000 tons.
