2013 TRAFFIC STATEMENT ST. MARYS FALLS CANAL, SAULT STE. MARIE, MICHIGAN U.S. ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS, DETROIT DISTRICT

The 2013 commercial navigation season through the United States locks began on March 25, 2013, and ended 297 days later on January 15, 2014. Between March 14-24, 2013, the U.S. Coast Guard cutters BISCAYNE BAY and MACKINAW and the Canadian Coast Guard cutter SAMUEL RISLEY passed through the Poe Lock for icebreaking operations.

The first commercial vessel for the season was the M/V (Motor Vessel) PAUL R. TREGURTHA (U.S.-flag) on March 25, upbound to load coal in Superior, Wisconsin. The last commercial vessel was the tug/barge unit VICTORY/JAMES L. KUBER (U.S.-flag), which passed downbound through the Poe Lock on January 15, 2014, with 25,913 tons of iron ore for Detroit.

Delays are defined as the elapsed time a vessel spends waiting to proceed with a lockage. Seventy-seven vessels were delayed by ice for a total of 47 hours and 5 minutes. Two vessels were delayed by ice on lock or lock equipment for a total of 1 hour and 46 minutes. Lock and hardware malfunctions accounted for six vessels being delayed a total of 5 hours and 6 minutes. Maintaining lock or lock equipment accounted for three vessels being delayed a total of 3 hours and 5 minutes. Three vessels were delayed by interference by other vessels for 1 hour and 2 minutes. One vessel was delayed 4 hours and 9 minutes due to tow accident or collision. Vessels detained by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, U.S. Coast Guard, or U.S. Department of Homeland Security accounted for 1 hour and 31 minutes of delays. Three vessels were delayed 3 hours and 23 minutes due to lock staff being occupied with other duties. Six vessels were delayed 4 hours and 15 minutes by tow staff occupied with other duties. Other delays affected three vessels for 1 hour and 37 minutes.

The largest cargo recorded for a single passage during the 2013 season was 67,058 tons of taconite (iron ore) carried by the M/V BURNS HARBOR (U.S.-flag) on September 19. The smallest cargo for a single passage was 30 tons of dredged material carried by the TUG MOHAWK on June 3.

The greatest seasonal cargo total transported by a single vessel was 2,735,027 tons carried by the M/V PAUL R. TREGURTHA.

Cargo flow was greatest during the month of May with 8,523,087 tons passing through the locks. A total of 3,799 cargo carriers passed through the locks during the 2013 season, a decrease of 283 from the 2012 season. An annual total of 70,404,194 tons of freight was recorded. This was 4,803,330 tons below the 2012 total. Total vessel passages decreased from 7,285 in 2012 to 6,910 in 2013. Freight decreased by 6.39 percent and total passages decreased by 5.15 percent.

Comparing the movement of cargo in and out of Lake Superior, 23 commodities experienced decreases from 2012 with iron ore seeing the biggest decrease in tons. Twelve (12) commodities experienced increases in tons. Several other cargos experienced increases or decreases of 100 percent; this was attributed to no cargo movement from the previous year or 2013.
